The strike referred to caused great excitement throughout West Lothian and was unique in this respect that following the Broxburn Oil Coy., Ltd., ejecting miners from their houses, wooden structures were erected where the erected families lived in communal style for many weeks. The strike leader was M^r John Wilson, a popular miners' agent and a native of Broxburn.
